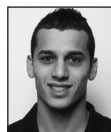

Career Highlights:

Winning a World Cup silver medal in 2006 (Bangkok, Thailand) and winning bronze at the 2002 Junior World Championships (Crete, Athens).

Interesting Facts:

- Following in his cousin's footsteps Ryan started in the sport at seven years of age in 1993.
- Winning numerous junior national titles, in 2002 Ryan won bronze in the U/17 U/55kg division at the 2002 World Junior Championships in Greece. The same year saw him debut in the National Open Team at the age of 16 competing at the 2002 Japan World Cup.
- In 2003 Ryan won the Korean Open and was awarded "best competitor of the tournament". After missing out on selection for Athens, he came back in 2005 to take out the National title in the open under 58kg division. A silver medal at the Bangkok World Cup in 2006 gave Ryan the confidence to go for Olympic selection.
- Ryan's older sister Lisa also competed for Australia in Taekwondo but retired following the 2007 World Championships.
- Ryan has a passion for music and production deferring his Audio Engineering studies to prepare for Beijing.
- With a childhood ambition to become a pro golfer, Ryan played regularly until 2005 with a handicap of 12.

Interesting Facts:

- With a father working as a taekwondo instructor Burak started learning the sport from the time he could walk!
- Between 1994 and 2004 Burak won 13 state titles and five national titles from 2002 - 2005 in both junior and senior events.
- He made his first national team at the 2002 World Junior Championships where he finished 4th and his senior national team debut the following year at the Korean Open at 18 years of age.
- Despite being the National champion in 2004 Burak was beaten for Olympic selection by his competitor in the final. Immediately turning his focus towards Beijing he participated in training camps with the Korean National team improving his top level competition and winning a bronze at the China Open in 2006.
- In October 2007, he placed 3rd at the World Olympic Qualifiers in Manchester qualifying a spot for Australia at 2008 Olympic Games.
- Despite a pelvic strain injury suffered earlier this year and preventing Burak from kicking for four weeks he took part in a pre Olympic training camp in Korea.
- A family affair Burak's has two older brothers and a younger sister all of whom have black belts in the sport. His sister competed at the 2007 Australian Youth Olympic Festival. Burak would eventually like to teach Taekwondo like his father.

Winning a bronze medal at the 2005 World Championships in Spain in the U/67kg.

Interesting Facts:

- Carmen's father, Andrew, competed in Taekwondo in Poland and after moving to Australia continued in the sport eventually introducing his children including Carmen at the age of eight.
- A bronze medal at the 2003 Australian Youth Olympic Festival and a silver at the Junior Asian Championships in the same year set Carmen on the road to success.
- Despite missing selection for the Athens Olympics, Carmen bounced back to produce a bronze medal winning performance at the 2005 World Championships having suffered an injury only three weeks before competition.
- Her form continued in 2006 winning the French and Polish Open, two silver medals at the Dutch and German Open in 2007 and a bronze at the Beijing Test Event earlier this year.
- An interest in graphic design Carmen has deferred her studies in Fine Art.
- Carmen has been instructing and assisting at her Taekwondo Club since she was a teenager. Her older sister Caroline, 24, and younger brother Jack, 16, also compete in Taekwondo - Caroline has represented Australia at the 1998 Junior World Championships and in 2007 was the first Australian female to win a gold medal at the Dutch Open.
- Carmen was also a state rep for Volleyball during her school years.

Career Highlights:

Winning the World Cup in 2006 and being the first Australian ever to win at a World Cup (Bangkok 2006) and winning the World Olympic Qualifiers in 2003 - my first attempt in the heavy weight category.

Interesting Facts:

- Tina began taekwondo in 1994 age 11. Achieving a black belt and knowing Taekwondo was becoming an Olympic sport inspired her to work hard.
- A member of the national team for nine years Tina was a reserve at the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games, placed 5th at the World Championships the following year and 2nd at the Asian Championships in 2002.
- In 2003 Tina clinched bronze at the World Championships (- 63kg) and gold at the World Olympic Qualifiers in Paris (+ 67kg category). Despite an outstanding lead up, Tina was disappointed after her first round loss at the Athens Olympics and "unofficially" retired from the sport in 2005 returning to University to finish her Psychology degree. She returned at the World Championships the same year reaching the quarterfinals on little training and preparation. That result and a win at the 2005 Korean Open renewed her focus in the sport.
- After a huge win at the World Cup in 2006 she suffered an injury while competing at the German Open leading 5 - 1 with only 48 seconds to go putting her out of competition for 8 months. Her first competition back was the 2008 Beijing Test Event placing 5th.
- Tina is the first ever Australian to win World Cup gold and be ranked No. 1 in the world. She has medalled internationally across four different categories throughout her senior career.
- Tina's boyfriend, Bahri Tanrikulu, is the current taekwondo World Champion and 2004 Olympic silver medallist competing for Turkey.
- Tina was a Former State Champion in Competitive Aerobics (WA) and has played tennis, football and netball.
